Closed Programs:

- **Medical Doctor Programs (MD):** The Faculty of Medicine accepts a limited number of exchange students who would like to enrol in a preparatory year (clerkship) for the program leading to the achievement of a medical degree: <http://medecine.umontreal.ca/etudes/docturat-en-medecine/etudiants-visiteurs/>.
Please note that the Faculty of Medicine reserves the right to select Exchange candidates;
- **Ph.D of Pharmaceutical Sciences (Pharm. Ph.D)**, excluding faculties who have specific agreements with the program;
- **Master’s degree of Medical Physics** (Department of Physics, Faculty of Arts and Sciences);
- **Master’s degree – Secondary Level education (2-811-1-3) is closed to exchange students;**
- **Master’s degree - Cellular Biology and Pathology is closed to exchange students;**
- **D.E.S.S. in journalism is closed to exchange students;**
- **D.E.S.S. in arts, creation and technology is closed to exchange students ;**
- **D.E.S.S. in media, culture and technology is closed to exchange students;**
- **Bachelor’s degree in Political Science and Philosophy** - Faculty of Arts and Sciences
- **Bachelor’s degree in Human Sciences (Baccalauréat en lettres et sciences humaines)** - Faculty of Arts and Sciences;
- **Certificates are continuing studies programs and are not offered to international students.**

Programs with particularities:

Department of Kinesiology	
<i>Department of Kinesiology</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Candidates whose first language is not French must present a certificate of proficiency corresponding to level C1 of the European Framework, or its equivalent. • Undergraduate and Master’s students are required to have completed at least the first year of their degree in order to be considered. • The exchange program places are very limited; therefore candidate selection is very competitive. Only applicants with an above-average academic record may be selected. • No internships are offered.
Faculty of Environmental Design	
<i>School of Architecture</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The School of Architecture negotiates in advance with its partners the number of students who can submit applications. • Only those interested in participating in an exchange for a full academic year (September to April) will be considered. • The School accepts a limited number of students pursuing a Bachelor’s degree of Architecture who would like to apply for their third year. • Candidates who present an application for the Master’s degree in architecture must have completed at least 4 years of study in their home university. • The number of places in the Master of Architecture is very limited • Prospective candidates must include a portfolio.
<i>School of Design</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prospective candidates must include a portfolio. • The Interior Design program is only open for the Fall semester. • Candidates for the Industrial Design and Interior Design programs must choose the courses from the following list.

<i>School of Urban Planning and Landscape Architecture</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The School accepts a limited number of students applying to the urban planning Master's degree program. The School of Urban Planning and Landscape Architecture accepts students applying to the Master's degree only for one semester. • Candidates to Landscape Architecture must provide a letter of intent and a portfolio. • The School accepts a limited number of exchange students. • The number of students that can apply is negotiated in advance with partners. • Students wishing to apply for the master's degree (first year) must have completed four years in a program with content in landscape.
Faculty of Arts and Sciences	
<i>Minor in arts and sciences</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students can take a maximum of 2 courses from the same concentration per semester.
<i>Bachelor degree in economic sciences and political science</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It is mandatory to take at least 2 political science courses in this program
<i>Graduate degree programs in International studies</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students applying to this programme whose first language is not French must submit a French language evaluation according to the Common European Framework which includes their level of written and oral French. • Students can take a maximum of one political science course and a maximum of one law course per semester.
<i>Department of Communications</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Department accepts limited exchange students and availability is negotiated in advance with partners. • Only the Bachelor and the Master in communication sciences are open to exchange students. • The number of places to the master's degree in communication is very limited. A good level of English is required.
<i>Department of political science</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students applying to this programme whose first language is not French must submit a French language evaluation according to the Common European Framework which includes their level of written and oral French. • Students must take at least two political science course per semester. • Students must take a maximum of 2 communication course per semester. • Exchange students submitted application in Bachelor's degree in International Studies may follow a maximum of 1 Law course.
<i>Department of Geography</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For the Master program students, students and their supervisors must contact a Professor from the Department before submitting an application. Those students must also follow the same program structure as Québec students enrolled at the Master's level (Master's thesis) (3-4 credit courses, including a research course). They will be enrolled in two supervised research courses.
<i>Department of Art History and Film Studies</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exchange students cannot take practical courses that are specific to the Bachelor's of Film Studies degree (1-171-1-0). Undergraduate candidates only have access to courses offered within the Film Studies Minor (1-171-4-0) or Major (1-171-2-0). • Candidates for the Undergraduate exchange program do not have access to seminars CIN6003A and B, CIN6053A, CIN6054A and CIN7001A which are reserved to students who submitted application in the programs of the Department of Art History and Film Studies and in Units of programs with which the Department of Art History and Film Studies has agreements.
<i>Department of French Language Literatures</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Candidates whose first language is not French must present a certificate of proficiency corresponding to level C1 for Undergraduate degree students and level C2 for the Graduate degree students of the Common European Framework, or its equivalent.

<i>Department of Psychology</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Department of Psychology accepts only a limited number of students enrolling to Master's or PhD courses. • No internships are offered. • Undergraduate exchange candidates must submit their applications at the latest in March. • Due to the high number of applications received each year, candidate selection is very competitive. Only applicants with an above-average academic record may be selected. • Candidates whose first language is not French must present a certificate of proficiency corresponding to level B2 of the Common European Framework, or its equivalent.
<i>Department of Economic sciences</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Due to the high number of applications received each year, candidate selection is very competitive. Only applicants with an above-average academic record may be selected.
<i>Department of Literatures and Languages of the World – English Studies</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students must provide a letter of intent in English.
<i>School of Psychoeducation : Bachelor and Master degree in psychoeducation</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No internships are offered. • Due to the high number of applications received each year, candidate selection is very competitive. Only applicants with an above-average academic record may be selected. • For Master degree courses, privileged students have a diploma of Undergraduate level (or equivalent) from psychology or criminology background. • Complete applications must be received no later than May 1st for the Bachelor degree courses. • Complete applications must be received no later than February 1st for the Master degree courses.
<i>School of Criminology</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The School of Criminology now imposes several restrictions with regard to student exchanges. Please consult this document.
<i>School of Industrial Relations</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only Undergraduate level candidates in Industrial Relations or related field (sciences du travail, sciences politiques, santé et sécurité au travail, ...) will be considered. • One or two Undergraduate level courses can be taken only under the academic advisor's recommendation. • Candidates whose first language is not French must present a certificate of proficiency corresponding to level C1 of the European Framework, or its equivalent. • The number of places in exchange programs is limited and only candidates above 12/20 or equivalent will be accepted. • Note that PhD programs are closed to exchange students with the exception of the research credits students.
<i>School of social working</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The School accepts limited exchange students and availability is negotiated in advance with partners.
Faculty of law	
<i>Faculty of law</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Due to the high number of applications received each year, candidate selection is competitive. Only applicants with an above-average academic record may be selected. • Bachelor's degree students must choose their courses from the list of courses open to international students.
Faculty of Medicine	
<i>School of Orthophony and Audiology</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Places are very limited for the Undergraduate degree in Orthophony and depend on the number of outgoing students. • The School of Orthophony and Audiology does not accept exchange students in Bachelor and Master's degree in Audiology programs.

<i>Department of Biomedical Sciences</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This department currently does not accept Bachelor's degree exchange students.
<i>Department of nutrition</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For the Undergraduate degree in nutrition programs: Candidates whose first language is not French must present a certificate of knowledge of the language minimally corresponding to 850/990 level to the International French test. • Bachelor's degree candidates must have completed at least the first year of their studies program. • Only courses from Undergraduate degree level can be chosen. • The number of places in exchange programs is limited and only candidates above the average will be accepted. • The program does not receive students for professional internships.
Faculty of Dentistry	
<i>Faculty of dentistry</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student exchanges are suspended for an indefinite period with the following universities: Montpellier, Nice and Paris 7.
School of Rehabilitation (School includes programs of Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy)	
<i>Bachelor's degree in Health sciences (physiotherapy) and Master in Physiotherapy</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Candidates whose first language is not French must present a certificate of knowledge of the language minimally corresponding to 785/990 level to the International French test. • Bachelor's degree candidates can only do an exchange at their 3rd Bachelor's year in winter semester. • The program welcomes students from universities with which it has signed specific bilateral agreements. • The School accepts a limited number of exchange students. • The admission of masters and PhD candidates is conditional on the program in their Home University includes mandatory internships.
<i>Bachelor and Master degree in Occupational Therapy sciences</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Candidates whose first language is not French must present a certificate of knowledge of the language minimally corresponding to 785/990 level to the International French test. • Candidates to Bachelor's degree must have completed at least the first year of their studies program. • The number of places in exchange programs is limited and only candidates above the average will be accepted. • Online preparatory modules may be required before classes begin. • The program welcomes for the clinic training only students from universities with which it signed specific bilateral agreements.
Faculty of Pharmacy	
<i>Faculty of Pharmacy</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Faculty of Pharmacy negotiates in advance with its partners the number of students who can submit an application. • Applications submitted by students whose scores are lower than the average will be rejected.
<i>D.E.S.S. - Drug Development</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This program never accepts new students for the winter semester because the courses offered in fall semester are prerequisites to the winter semester courses.
Faculty of Education	
<i>Faculty of Education sciences</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Master degree – High School level education (2-811-1-3) is closed to exchange students. • Undergraduate and Master's applicants must have completed at least one year of their degree to be considered. • Note that the number of places is very limited in the Bachelor of physical education and health teaching programs. • Deadline to submit a nomination for the winter semester: June 1st
<i>Department of Administration and</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Candidates whose first language is not French must present a certificate of proficiency corresponding to level B2 of the Common European Framework, or its

Undergraduate students can only enroll in one of the following 3rd-year courses: SOI 2609/2723 or SOI3516/3716. Deadline application for Fall: April 1st and for Winter: September 30th Candidates whose first language is not French must present a certificate of proficiency corresponding to at least 785/990 of the TFI (Test de français international) and get a level 4 or more at the writing module. <i>PhD in Veterinary Medicine, Undergraduate level</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The School of Veterinary Medicine only admits students from partner universities with whom an agreement has already been signed. Student exchange programs only apply to clinical placements and 3rd year studies, no student will be admitted to other levels of study. The School will only admit 10 students per semester (Fall or Winter) for clinical placements. 																																								
<i>Graduate level</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The School of Veterinary Medicine accepts only students from universities with 																																								

	<p>which it has signed specific bilateral agreements.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The School welcomes students in its research, internship and residency programs. • Students wishing to partake in the student exchange program will have to obtain prior authorizations from a UdeM Veterinary Medicine professor before sending an application.
School of Music	
<p><i>Undergraduate and Graduate levels</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students must provide proof of TFI (Test de français International) for their knowledge of the French language level. We require a score of 605/990. • The DESS programs are not open to exchange students. • There are 3 types of teaching at the School of Music: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Individual (instrument and composition) 2. Small groups (chamber music, composition workshops, etc) 3. Lectures and large ensembles. • All individual courses (instrument and composition), and jazz ensembles are not authorized in exchange programs, unless applications come from our privileged partners, the level of the applicants meets our requirements and upon availabilities. <u>List of partners :</u> http://www.musique.umontreal.ca/programmes/programmes_echanges.html • Please note that the Jazz section is also exclusively reserved for privileged partners. • Students who wish to register for instrumental workshops must provide an audio or video recording with their application.
